Lesson Title: Colds and Flu, Part 2

Grade Level and Course: 5, Health

Time Segment of Lesson: 40 minutes

Objective(s) of the Lesson: Students will be able to...

1. Demonstrate understanding of common cold and flu symptoms and related vocabulary
2. Communicate symptoms in a roleplay dialogue situation
3. Ask and answer simple questions in a roleplay dialogue situation

Differentiation of Instruction

All students are L2 English learners of various levels.

Differentiation of Instruction
Lower-level English speakers will be encouraged to use key English vocabulary but allowed to use Chinese during the roleplay activity
Intermediate-level English learners will be encouraged to use only English in the role-play activity.
Advanced students will be asked to include in their role play a distinction between cold and flu (i.e., diagnosis of symptoms), with the option of including allergy symptoms and integrating new vocabulary from the dialogue worksheets

Big Ideas to Be Addressed in the Lesson:

Describing common symptoms associated with colds and influenza; asking and answering simple questions in a doctor–patient dialogue

Lesson Activities (outline):

1. Table groups complete vocabulary review (fill in the blanks) 5 min.
2. Check answers 3 min.
3. Watch doctor's office video and do repeat exercise 5 min.
4. Role-play activity 15 min.
5. Demonstration in front of class 6 min.
6. Wrap-up 3 min.
7. Transition: prepare to leave
